Nonpartisan Election Official Preparedness Compilation *Fall 2026*

The 2026 midterm elections are taking place in an increasingly complex and fraught environment for election administration. In addition to the traditional operational demands of conducting secure, accessible, and accurate elections, election officials are facing new and evolving challenges: potential interference from multiple actors including the federal government, the potential for increased voter intimidation, increased digital or physical security concerns, increased misinformation, and more.

As part of preparing for effective election administration, **election officials should consult in advance with their counsel (such as the municipal, city, or county attorney) about these threats, and if appropriate, consider whether to engage outside legal counsel.** Given the high likelihood that any legal issues emerging during the election period will be fast-moving, **consider beginning the process now of engaging outside legal counsel**, if that is your jurisdiction's preferred approach.

This 2026 Election Official Preparedness Compilation is intended to serve as a centralized collection of available resources developed by nonpartisan nonprofit organizations and election experts. The resources are organized by topic to help election officials quickly identify guidance relevant to their needs, including:

- Cross-cutting resources;
- General election preparedness;
- Election interference resources;
- Certification resources;
- Threats, harassment, and staff safety;
- Artificial intelligence and cybersecurity;
- Communications resources; and,
- Resources for other officials.
